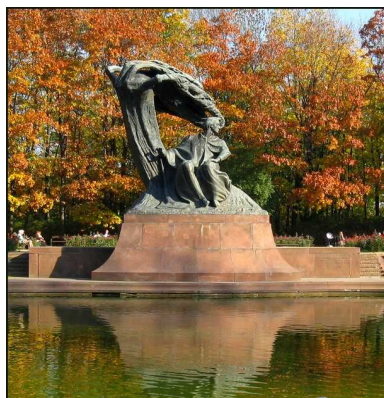
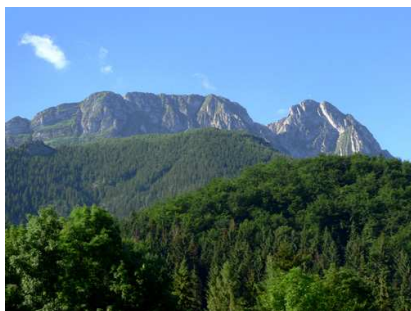

FREDERICK CHOPIN and FAMOUS POLES



Day 1 – WARSAW

Arrival to Warsaw. Transfer to your hotel and accommodation. In the afternoon – walking the Old Town streets, after we invite you for dinner at a local restaurant with folk band presenting dances and songs from Mazovia region (can be noticed evident influence of folk music on Chopin's work). Return to the hotel for overnight.

Day 2 – WARSAW OF FREDERICK CHOPIN

After breakfast guided tour and we visit places connected with life and creation of Frederick Chopin: Czapski Palace with the Chopins' drawing room, Church of St. Cross where the urn with Chopin's heart is buried, Ostrogski Palace with Chopin's museum, Royal Łazienki Park with Chopin's monument. Lunch. In the afternoon unforgettable piano recital in one of Warsaw Palaces with a glass of champagne. Overnight.

Day 3 – WARSAW-ŻELAZOWA WOLA-BROCHÓW-WARSAW

After breakfast departure for Żelazowa Wola – Frederick Chopin's birthplace (the village situated outside Warsaw). After visit continue to St.Roch Church in Brochów where the composer was baptized. After visit drive to Kraków. Dinner and overnight.

Day 4 – KRAKÓW

Breakfast. Sightseeing of Kraków, the most beautiful city of Europe. In 1978 Kraków was listed on the List Of World Heritage by UNESCO. Through the centuries there were studding at Jagiellonian University famous persons as Nicolas Copernicus, well-known astronomer, or John Paul II, the pope. Frederick Chopin also visited this city. Nowadays many excellent artists from all over Europe came here to soak up the spirit medieval town. In the afternoon time at leisure. Dinner at a restaurant in the Old Town. Overnight.

Optionally:

1. Sightseeing of Wieliczka Salt Mine – 700 years old and still working (the underground museum with figures made of salt)
2. Chopin's recital in one of the oldest churches in Kraków

Day 5 – KRAKÓW-ZAKOPANE-KRAKÓW

After breakfast full day excursion to Zakopane. Zakopane was very important centre of Polish culture in the end of XIX and the beginning of XX centuries, inhabited not only by many painters charmed by Tatra landscapes but also by composers delighted by wild nature of the region and colorful folklore of highlanders. Zakopane is considered winter capital of Poland.

After sightseeing free time to explore Krupówki – main promenade of the city. Early dinner with folk show by the highlanders. Return to Kraków for overnight.

Day 6 – KRAKÓW-OBŁĘGOREK-WARSAW

Breakfast. Return to Warsaw via Oblęgorek. There is the museum of Henry Sienkiewicz, in the manor built in 1880. His novel "Quo vadis" is known by multiple movie adaptations. In 1905 the writer was granted Nobel Prize. Farewell dinner in Warsaw. Overnight.

Day 7 – WARSAW

After breakfast transfer to the airport for your flight home.
